President's Message

Dear Members,

If you were one of the 88 members who attended this month's Easter themed General Assembly, you will know that we continue to be very fortunate with our speakers.

Steve Burgess from Age in Spain told us the history of the organisation and described the work they do. You will find a full report elsewhere in this newsletter. Two of his key messages were not to be afraid to ask for help and not to leave the big decisions too late. Asking for help need not mean giving up your precious independence. Often the opposite is true: getting the right help allows people to remain independent for longer. Many of the most difficult cases they see could have been avoided with just a little forward planning.

It was very clear that Age in Spain's values are fully aligned with our own. Indeed, Steve told me after his presentation that he and his colleagues enjoy working with u3a associations precisely because they encounter none of the fear of competition that they find with some other charities and voluntary organisations. On this basis we agreed to continue to publicise each other's activities wherever appropriate.

More generally we are entering one of the busiest times of our year, with a wide range of exciting trips and events to look forward to in the coming weeks, arranged by our fabulous Travel & Entertainment and Goodwill teams. I cannot say often enough how grateful I am to everyone who helps to plan and manage these activities on our behalf. Observing from behind the scenes I can see just how much work is involved ahead of each event and on the actual day.

One good example is our May General Assembly, which falls on the 80th anniversary of VE Day. Our committee members and many others have been working for weeks to deliver an event which will not only recognise the importance of the day but also incorporate some fun activities and suitable refreshments. After a number of GAs where we have seen attendance in the high 80s or low 90s perhaps this will be the day when we break through the 100 barrier!

Informing, Empowering, Connecting!

We were delighted to welcome Steve Burgess, Operations Manager for the charity "Age in Spain", and his colleague Teresa Filipovic, at our April General Assembly to talk to us about preparing for the future. Age in Spain is a registered charity which started in 1988 in Majorca to provide support to British people living in Spain. It's mission is to "Love later life" through empowering, informing and providing information in an accessible format.

Their <u>website</u> provides useful step by step guides, for example on how to renew one's NIE card, and a wealth of useful information. They also have telephone information lines which are manned three mornings a week by volunteers to provide personal help and information (see details at the end). They receive some 3500 calls and 80,000 online enquiries annually from people who are not always prepared for later life and need some help and advice.

They work with UK charities, for example, to obtain support for veterans, and can also provide extra support services and advocacy where required with social services, healthcare and town halls.

In addition, they operate a telephone friendship service manned by volunteers who carry our weekly friendly chat calls for people who cannot get to social events and miss a friendly chat.

Steve asked everyone in the room to think about their priorities when planning for the future and as we age, and lively discussions could be heard at tables. Steve then identified what he saw as the key ones we should all be thinking about:

Independence Security – feeling safe Financial stability Connection with a community – friendships, keeping active, keeping involved Health and members agreed with these.

Steve talked about three key myths that exist and which may prevent people from seeking help: 1. Care home fear, the belief that we will have to end our days in a care home, but Steve explained various alternatives and that care homes should be seen as a last resort

2. Losing independence, but if one seeks help early on it can actually enhance independence.

3. Believing it is too soon to think about the future. Don't wait until it's too late, planning ahead gives choice.

He talked about how individual needs can change over time and that this can be a circle: from independent living, to needing occasional support e.g. after an accident or operation, to needing regular support, and hopefully a return to independent living in some cases.

The care system in Spain – key points to note:

- Any involvement in the Spanish care system is not quick so it is essential to think and plan ahead if we feel this may be necessary.
- Family are expected to take responsibility in Spain, even distant family.
- Social Services are hugely stretched and it can take years to get help.
- State support is means tested and can be part funded or not funded.
- It is only available to permanent residents who have been on the padron for five years minimum and have been resident here for two years before applying
- If you receive in hospital care and the doctor has concerns s/he can involve the hospital social worker. This can be a quicker route.
- Otherwise an application for state care is usually made through the town hall with support from your local doctor

Care at home

This can be state funded by way of financial support or care staff but they may not speak any English and you may have to pay a contribution.

Private care at home can cost 12-25 e per hour. Ideally ask for local recommendations for carers or local people who can help e.g. with shopping, cooking, cleaning which may be cheaper.

If using an agency check it is registered.

Private care homes

Can cost 1500-3500 per month





Funded by the state and one must be assessed financially to be offered a state bed. You may have to surrender your pension and be given 20-30e a week spending money. Likely they will be Spanish speaking and can be far away, wherever a bed is available.

Financial assistance

Under the Brexit leaving agreement British nationals can claim

Attendance Allowance from the UK govt. It is a comprehensive form (30 Pages) detailing health issues, care/support needs, what you can or can't do for yourself. It is important to state worst case scenarios. Age in Spain can help with this claim. (So can JVH and Help of Marina Alta).

If one's total income is below 7000e a year there are Spanish state benefits you may be able to claim if you have been resident for more than five years.

Veterans Benevolent Fund.

If you or your partner is/was a veteran and you have no savings, you can be assessed to help with the cost of an essential item e.g. wheelchair, stair lift, washing machine etc.

Royal British legion – Age in Spain can connect someone with them in their area

British Benevolent Fund – a possible last resort e.g. a grant to repatriate back to the UK, pay for funeral costs etc if no funds are available

Returning to the UK

If you are considering moving back to the UK in later life it is important to note it can take up to six months to prove habitual residence back in the UK and apply for benefits etc.

Social Services are very stretched in the UK as well as in Spain

Age in Spain has prepared a guide on disengaging from Spain and re-engaging in the UK

End of life planning

Age in Spain has a guide covering Powers of Attorney and wills and operates a wills service. Key points:

- 1. Plan early think two years ahead! Don't wait until help is urgently needed.
- 2. Consider many care options: at home, residential villages, supported living, care homes
- 3. Think/plan/share/shelve and enjoy!

u3a Trip to Murcia - 11th March 2025

44 members headed off from Jalon Rastro Car Park at 8.15 on Tuesday 11th March . After some recent miserable weather fingers were crossed for a dry day! After a short coffee break at Crevillentes we arrived in the City of Murcia at 11 o'clock. Beautiful sunshine greeted us!

For us, like quite a few others, it was our first visit to Murcia City itself and we were not to be disappointed. I think the majority headed to the Catedral de Murcia first and what an interesting building it was. We got a dual ticket which also gave us entry into the Museum next door. The interior of the chapel is largely Gothic in style but the façade is Baroque. We learned that construction of the cathedral began in the 14th century. It continued to evolve until the 18th Century. It is made up of three naves, an apse and 23 Chapels. The Chapels dedicated to the patron saints of the labour unions and to the burials of the bishops and nobles that helped or collaborated with the construction of the cathedral. We had a very interesting walk round both buildings.










Heading out into the sunshine we visited another building we had been recommended to visit – the Casino! Not for gambling I hasten to add but to admire the building itself – it was beautiful.


